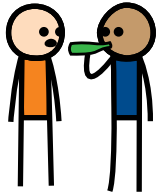

## WE CAN PREVENT VIOLENCE:

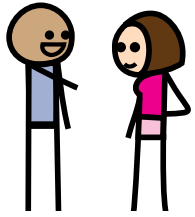

NJCASA and its allies are committed to **primary prevention**—changing the social environment that allows and fosters the exploitation of one person by another.

## EVERY COMMUNITY CAN PREVENT VIOLENCE:

The crucial first step is to acknowledge that sexual violence is a community problem, not a private or individual problem. We all share a responsibility to make sure no one in the community is living with the threat or experience of being violated.

NJCASA provides technical assistance and trainings for organizations and communities that want to end sexual violence.

NJCASA applies the research and tools of public health science to reduce the epidemic of violence. These include:

- Focus on reducing the risk that violence will be perpetrated
- Give people the skills to take responsibility, as by-standers, before violence occurs
- Increase awareness of how media fosters attitudes and expectations that encourage or condone violence
- Evaluate programs to ensure measurable results in reducing violence.
